# IN THE SUPERIOR COURT OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA IN AND FOR THE COUNTY OF NEVADA

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In Re Reduction of Court Operations in Response to COVID-19 Pandemic

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO.

Whereas the President of the United States of America has declared a national emergency in response to the COVID-19 pandemic;

Whereas the Governor of the State of California has declared a public health emergency throughout the State in response to the spread of COVID-19;

Whereas Nevada County has declared a local public health emergency in response to the increased spread of COVID-19 across neighboring counties as well as this county;

Whereas the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, California Department of Public Health and other public health authorities have advised the taking of precautions, including limiting gathering sizes and practicing social distancing, to reduce the possibility of exposure to the virus and to slow the spread of the disease;

Whereas many persons at risk of serious or even fatal illness are involved in court proceedings as parties, attorneys, or court staff, or are being asked to serve the court as jurors, or observe court proceedings as members of the public;

Whereas slowing the transmission of the virus in the community is an important part of mitigating the impact of the disease on potentially vulnerable individuals and reducing the immediate burden on the health care system and the community at large;

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Whereas the need for in court hearings and trials under constitutional and statutory law must be balanced against the current risks stemming from associated interpersonal contact;

Whereas certain specific emergency orders have been granted under Government Code Section 68115 and the March 16, 2020 order of Chief Justice Tani G. Cantil-Sakauye, Chair of the Judicial Council of California, in response to the March 13, 2020 request for an emergency order by this court,

Accordingly, in order to protect public health, reduce the size of public gatherings and unnecessary travel, and ensure the ability to deliver fair and impartial justice to all those who come before the court, the court **HEREBY ORDERS AS FOLLOWS**:

- 1. Both the Nevada City courthouse and the Truckee courthouse will remain open for restricted business, as set forth below.
- 2. From March 19, 2020 until April 14, 2020, only the following functions will be conducted by the court:
- a. Civil Temporary Restraining Orders
- b. Family Temporary Restraining Orders
- c. Domestic Violence Restraining Orders
- d. Civil Ex Parte Proceedings
- e. Family Ex Parte Proceedings
- f. Probate Ex Parte Hearings
- g. Probate Emergency Petitions for Temporary Conservatorship
- h. Probate Emergency Petitions for Temporary Guardianship
- i. Search Warrants

All in-custody criminal matters listed in j, m, n and o, below, will be conducted via videoconference unless a party requests an in-court appearance. Preliminary hearings require the defendant to be present in court.

- j. In Custody Arraignments
- k. No Time Waiver Criminal Preliminary Hearings
- 1. Criminal Ex Parte Hearings
- m. Bail Review

#### 4. **DUI COURT**:

**Nevada City**: The dates currently set for DUI Court between March 18, 2020 and April 14, 2020 are vacated. Future dates remain set unless vacated by subsequent order of the court.

Truckee: DUI Court in Truckee on April 6, 2020 is vacated.

### 5. ADULT DRUG COURT:

The dates currently set for Adult Drug Court between March 18, 2020 and April 14, 2020 are vacated. Future dates remain set unless vacated by subsequent order of the court.

# 6. PROP 36 COURT:

The dates currently set for Prop 36 Court between March 18, 2020 and April 14, 2020 are vacated. Future dates remain set unless vacated by subsequent order of the court.

7. Any previously issued orders to appear in court between March 19, 2020 and April 14, 2020, except orders to appear issued in any of the hearings delineated in Paragraphs 2 through 6 above, are vacated.

# 8. JURY TRIALS AND OTHER CALENDARED MATTERS:

All other scheduled proceedings between March 18, 2020 and April 14, 2020, including Civil and Criminal jury trials, are VACATED. Counsel and non-represented parties for all vacated matters will be notified by the Clerk of dates to appear in the future.

9. Any counsel or parties with vacated Criminal or Civil cases may file an ex parte application requesting the calendaring of proceedings based on an appropriate showing of good cause. Any such request must comply with all applicable procedural requirements under local rules and rules of procedure.

#### 10. SELF-SURRENDERS:

Nevada City: Defendants with warrants in misdemeanor cases may self-surrender on Wednesdays between 8:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. Defendants with warrants in felony

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cases may self-surrender on Thursdays between 8:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. Self-surrenders will be handled at the Department 3 window on the second floor of the courthouse.

Truckee: Defendants with warrants may self-surrender on Mondays at 8:00 a.m.

# 11. PUBLIC LAW CENTER:

The Public Law Center shall be closed to all in-person assistance between March 18, 2020 and April 14, 2020. Public Law Center staff will assist the public via email (selfhelpcenter@nccourt.net) and telephone (530-362-4309, extension 4).

# 12. JURORS:

Jurors summoned to appear between March 18, 2020 and April 14, 2020 need not appear on said date. Jurors will be re-summoned for a date in the future.

# 13. SMALL CLAIMS COURT:

All small claims court trials between March 19, 2020 and April 14, 2020 are vacated. The parties will be notified by the court of new trial dates.

# 14. TRAFFIC:

All currently scheduled hearings in traffic matters are vacated. Cases will be continued for 90 days. The parties will be notified by the court of new dates.

- 15. All individuals in the gallery of each courtroom must sit at least six (6) feet apart and all other individuals in other portions of the courtroom, to the extent feasible, must sit at least six (6) feet apart.
- 16. This order may be modified, expanded, or superseded at any time to account for the developing nature of the public health emergency.

IT IS SO ORDERED.
