DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY FOR FINANCIAL TRANSACTIONS AND ADMINISTRATIVE MATTERS

The Presiding Judge hereby delegates authority, pursuant to California Rule of Court 10.603(b)(l)(F) 14 and 10.603(c)(6)(D), to approve any procurements, contracts, expenditures, and allocations of funds within the following approval limits:

Position	Approval Limits
Finance Committee	All Amounts
Court Executive Officer	\$250,000
Directors & Managers	\$10,000
Supervisors	\$1,000
FLF/SHC Attorney	\$1,000

In addition to the foregoing general limits, the following exceptions shall apply:

Authority is hereby given to the Court Executive Officer for the approval of any Intra-branch Agreement (IBA) or Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) or grant between the court and the Judicial Council of California which contemplates the court receiving revenue in excess of the aforementioned approval limits.

Authority is hereby granted to the Court Executive Officer or designee for the allocation and release of funds to honor payroll and benefits commitments in accordance with prior authorization from the Presiding Judge, Finance Committee, or Executive Officer as indicated in an MOU, PAF, or other mode of memorialization in excess of the aforementioned

approval limits.

Authority is hereby given to the Court Executive Officer or designee to process financial transactions previously authorized by the Presiding Judge, Finance Committee, or Executive Officer or as otherwise required by law in excess of the aforementioned approval limits. The Executive Officer may not exercise this authority for transactions they have authorized themselves.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, the following individuals are authorized to process contracts, expenditures, or allocation of funds when individually approved to do so in writing or email by someone with the adequate approval authority (as defined in the previous paragraphs): Operations Director, IT Director, Administrative Services Manager, HR Analyst, Fiscal Analyst, Accounting Specialist, Administrative Assistant.

The Presiding Judge hereby delegates authority, pursuant to California Rule of Court 10.603(c)(10)(A), the duty to (1) maintain records of outstanding transcripts to be completed by each reporter; (2) reassign court reporters as necessary to facilitate prompt completion of transcripts; and (3) review reporters' requests for extensions of time to complete transcripts in appeals.

This order is effective January 1, 2025 and supersedes Executive Order #212.
