GENERAL ORDER

**AUTHORIZED PURSUANT TO
GOVERNMENT CODE
SECTION 68115 BY CHAIR OF
JUDICIAL COUNCIL**

Exercising the authority granted under Government Code section 68115 and the February 19, 2026, Order (“Order”) of Chief Justice Patricia Guerrero, Chair of the Judicial Council of California, issued in response to the request for an emergency order made by the Superior Court of Nevada County (“Court”) on this same date, this Court **HEREBY FINDS AND ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:**

1. For purposes of computing time for filing papers with the Court under Code of Civil Procedure sections 12 and 12a, February 19, 2026, is deemed a holiday because the emergency conditions described in the Order have substantially interfered with the public’s ability to file papers in a court facility on that date (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(4));

2. For purposes of computing time under Penal Code section 825, February 19, 2026, is deemed a holiday because the emergency conditions described in the Order prevent the court from conducting proceedings as necessary to satisfy the deadlines on that date (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(5));


3. Any judge of the Court may extend the time periods provided in sections 583.310 and 583.320 of the Code of Civil Procedure to bring an action to trial by not more than one (1)

1 day, applicable only to cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire on February
2 19, 2026 (Gov. Code, § 68115, subd. (a)(6)); and

4 4. Any judge of the Court may extend the time period provided in section 859b of
5 the Penal Code for the holding of a preliminary examination from 10 court days to not more than
6 13 court days, applicable only to cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire on
7 February 19, 2026 (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(9)).

8 THIS ORDER IS EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY.

THE JUDICIAL COUNCIL OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

Because of a severe winter storm resulting in hazardous travel conditions, it has been determined that the conditions described in section 68115 of the Government Code are met with regard to the Superior Court of California, County of Nevada. Upon the request of Acting Presiding Judge S. Robert Tice-Raskin, it is ordered that the Superior Court of Nevada County is authorized to do the following:

- Declare that February 19, 2026, be deemed a holiday for purposes of computing the time for filing papers with the court under Code of Civil Procedure sections 12 and 12a, if the above-described emergency conditions substantially interfere with the public's ability to file papers in a court facility on that date (Gov. Code, § 68115, subd. (a)(4));
- Declare that February 19, 2026, be deemed a holiday for purposes of computing time under Penal Code section 825, if the above-described emergency conditions prevent the court from conducting proceedings as necessary to satisfy the deadlines on that date (Gov. Code, § 68115, subd. (a)(5));
- Extend the time periods provided in sections 583.310 and 583.320 of the Code of Civil Procedure to bring an action to trial by not more than one (1) day, applicable only to cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire on February 19, 2026 (Gov. Code, § 68115, subd. (a)(6)); and
- Extend the time period provided in section 859b of the Penal Code for the holding of a preliminary examination from 10 court days to not more than 13 court days, applicable only to cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire on February 19, 2026 (Gov. Code, § 68115, subd. (a)(9)).
